<p><b>Vision</b></p> <p>The Drama department aims to support students in discovering their passions and to develop skills and knowledge in the study of drama and theatre. We believe that through developing students’ confidence and communication skills, we can help them find their unique voices and prepare them for the adult world. We provide them with vital transferable skills; students develop their ability to work collaboratively and creatively through creating, developing, rehearsing and evaluating work.</p> <p><b>Purpose</b> of the curriculum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● High quality lessons</li> <li>● All students to perform and challenge themselves</li> <li>● A culture of working in mixed groups every lesson</li> <li>● All students to take part</li> <li>● Fosters community participation through collaborative performance.</li> <li>● All students should grow in confidence and creativity. Leaving the class inspired and with new confidence in their performance ability.</li> </ul>	<p>How is the curriculum <b>delivered</b>?</p> <p>Students will learn or refine a skill in a lesson. Learning about the theory behind a performance style/ genre/topic. Students will then have time to practice this skill in a safe environment to perform to their peers. This performance is then self, peer and teacher evaluated so improvements can be made in the future.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The aim of the curriculum is to build students confidence and understanding of performance and transfer these skills into other areas of their learning.</li> <li>● We aim to improve the Oracy of all students through performance and group discussions.</li> <li>● All students are able to access the curriculum regardless if they are SEND / PP / EAL</li> <li>● In Drama we build off of prior learning and expectations are often modelled by the teacher in lessons.</li> <li>● Students are often given feedback by their teacher and work is assessed at least once every half term.</li> <li>● Drama not only develops skills in the creative field but has many transferable skills that can be used in all different careers.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Things to consider...</b></p> <p>Drama has a positive impact not only academically but holistically with all students who take it. Work is regularly assessed and students are given time to reflect on how they can improve their drama skills. Lessons are observed where teachers can give feedback on how improvements can be made to the learning and every half term students are given the opportunity to review the teaching and learning and voice their opinions on the subject. This feedback is then reviewed by the subject leader and changes are made within the department.</p> <p>Results in the department are good with 90% of students achieving grades 4-9 and 50% achieving 7-9 in 2024. At present there is no KS5 provision in Drama but we aim to expand this in the near future.</p> <p>Students in Drama develop to be well rounded confident individuals who work well both independently and as part of a team.</p>
