

Definition

Calmness and composure, especially in a difficult situation.

- The defeat was taken with equanimity by the team.
- The Olympic diver displayed remarkable equanimity on the platform.
- She found that spending time in prayer helped to restore her equanimity.


What does this have to do with our Mission of the Month?
