A panache was originally an ornamental tuft of feathers, especially on a helmet. How did it get it's modern definition? The word panache comes from the Latin pinnaculum, meaning 'small wing'

This became the name for a showy, feathery plume on a hat or helmet

Which then came to be used to refer to someone who acted in a grand or stylish manner
