PPA Chairman's Report 2017



Dear Past Staff and Past Pupils,

I am writing this brief report from Malta where I am on holiday for a few weeks. The weather is scorching hot and today reached nearly 40c . The sea though is lovely and fresh. I still managed to play golf even though it is so hot. There has been a general election in Malta just 5 days before our election in England. However, unlike the UK, the Maltese Labour party was elected again with a landslide majority. The Maltese are very politically conscious and the turnout to vote is always above 90%.

Joseph Muscat is the Prime minister and he is also this year president of the European Union. The Maltese are very unhappy that we voted for Brexit as they are very Pro-European and also very Pro-UK. The country has benefited enormously from EU funding and this can be seen particularly in the improvements to the roads.

As for my health, after a difficult year, I am pleased to say that that things are going well and I feel fine apart from arthritic knees which are quite a common complaint when one gets to my age!

A sad event that I attended earlier this year was the funeral of Fred Bowden a former Chairman of Governors at St Mark's. Fred was a great supporter of the school as was his dear wife Jean who ran a very successful parent association for me. The Bowdens had 3 children at the School - John, Anne and Lucy. I was fortunate to have Fred as my Chairman at a difficult time in the early 90s for the School when we were desperate for more funding in order to accommodate a rising roll and improve our facilities particularly for science and the 6th form. Fred and the governors backed my interest in Grant Maintained status which would have freed us from LEA control and provide substantial more funding.

Hounslow LEA clearly were concerned as was the Diocese that we were about to opt out of LEA control. As a result we were promised their support for a government building grant. The consequence of this was that the governors stepped back from opting out and with the backing of Her Majesty's Inspectors and under the local MP Patrick Ground, we received a government grant of over 2 million pounds that enabled us to build a magnificent state of the art science centre and re-house the 6th form in the more spacious and appropriate St. Michael's Centre. This was a huge boost to the School and was a catalyst for tremendous improvements in academic standards and rising expectations that has given St Mark's a national reputation as one of the top comprehensive schools in the country. So, thank you Fred for you have been very much part of the success story that is St Mark's. May you rest in Peace.


1960's leavers
