Empathy (noun)

The ability to understand and share the feelings of another.

Preferential option for the poor

A preferential option for the poor means that we show **empathy** by thinking first about the needs of those who are the most vulnerable. Jesus taught that when we feed the hungry, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, look after the sick and visit those imprisoned, we are looking after Him.
