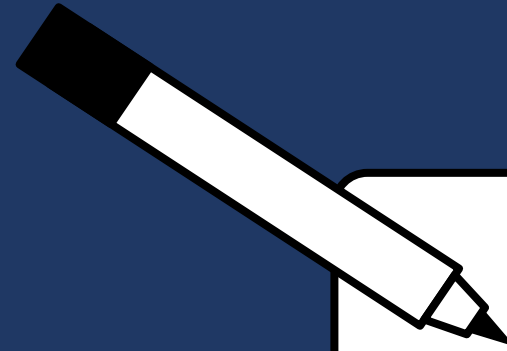
Resolution (noun)
