- Pharrell Williams has an idiosyncratic taste in hats.



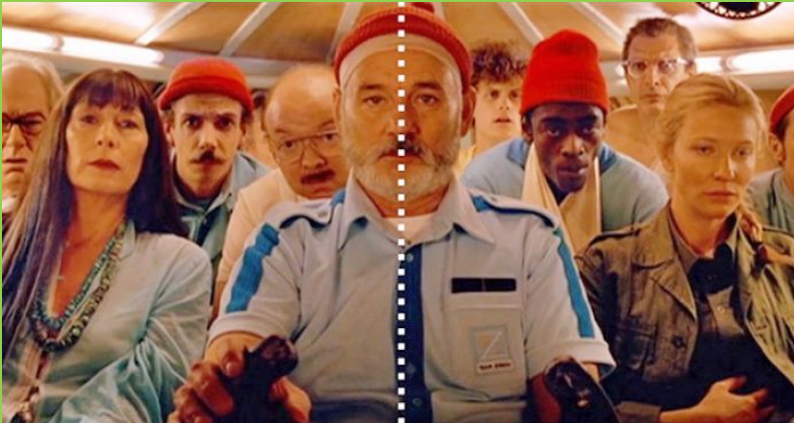
Idiosyncratic (adjective)
