As you are aware our education system requires young people to make choices, while they are still in school, that have implications for their future progression opportunities when they leave St Mark's (either at the end of Year 11 or Year 13).

As a school we take seriously our role in helping students with their choices and transitions, but also in equipping them with the skills to deal with future career decisions.

Young people often turn to their parents for advice long before they seek the opinion of teachers and careers advisers. In these newsletters we hope to keep you provided with good quality careers information and access to helpful resources.

Our Careers Programme is planned to ensure that all students spend some time each academic year on careers education. These CEIAG Newsletters will inform you of some of the things that have been happening and key events that will be happening, during this academic year.

We are also asking for your help and assistance with a specific activity we are running at the end of the school year, on **Thursday 16th July** and inviting you to help us with other aspects of the careers education and guidance we wish to give to our students.

During National Apprenticeship Week in February 2020, all students in Years 7-10 had lessons on apprenticeships and were given the opportunity to learn about the wide range of apprenticeships that are currently available. Some of our KS3 students who put excellent effort into completing their Apprenticeship booklets were awarded with certificates.

Earlier in the academic year, a former student Joe Spragg, came into school to launch the 'Step into the NHS' lessons for our Year 9 students. Joe spoke about the academic route and training he took, after completing his A levels at St Mark's, that led to him becoming a physiotherapist. He explained the varied role of a physiotherapist. Through the following lessons students were made aware of the huge range of career opportunities available within the NHS.

Many of our Year 11 students have been receiving individual careers advice and guidance from Aman Kaur, our Careers Adviser from the Hounslow Connexions Team.

In January, a small group of students who are considering College or an Apprenticeship after Year 11, attended the 'Zone In' event in January, organised by the Hounslow Connexions Team. It provided them with an opportunity to meet representatives from the Colleges and look at alternative pathways.

In school we have particular members of staff in school who ensure our students are clear of career opportunities that can come through STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and mathematics). Some girls in Year 9 with a keen interest in STEM subjects had the opportunity to meet women in top level science and engineering positions, on a STEM trip. However, each curriculum area is able to demonstrate how studies, for example, in arts, humanities and languages is able to link to the world of work.

Labour Market Information

When it comes to careers, we all need access to good-quality information about the opportunities available and the progression options that follow from them.

Career and labour market information covers not only the nature of jobs, qualifications and training, pay levels and so on but details about the employers and organisations providing the jobs and information about the wider economy.

LMI For All is a website that provides information about the UK labour market. (*LMI for All was originally funded by the UK Commission for Employment and Skills (UKCES). UKCES closed down in early 2017 and the project was taken over by the Department for Education (DfE). The contract is currently awarded to a consortium led by the Institute for Employment Research at the University of Warwick with technical development being undertaken by Pontydysgu.)*

They have a 'Careerometer widget' that can be used to explore and compare key information about occupations and help students identify potential careers.

It provides access to a selection of UK headline data relating to pay, weekly hours of work and future employment prospects for different occupations, as well as description of the occupation.
