Our fifteen Chaplaincy Newsletter is shared with you as we approach the end of school year. We thank you for your continued support and prayers throughout the year.


School Ministries

Special thanks to the Prayer Warriors Chaplaincy team who organised this prayer event.





After the Mass, we enjoyed a lovely picnic in a nearby park dotted with flowers. We made loads of friends (pictured below), played games and were even rewarded with sweets and fruit juice!


