Pastoral Care

After half-term we will be launching an additional pastoral support programme for our students that will begin in September 2021. We will be offering weekly peer support groups for our students who have experienced a significant loss or painful experience. The organisation behind the programme is called RAINBOWS. At secondary level, the groups are called Spectrum.

When something significant happens in a family, the entire family is affected. If a parent or sibling dies, a divorce or separation happens, or some other painful loss occurs, not only do the parents grieve, the children do also. Children and young people may find it extremely difficult to verbalise their feelings of grief because of their age and inexperience.

The Spectrum programme is a peer support programme which provides young people with a trusted adult and a group of their peers with whom they can work through their grief, build a stronger sense of self-esteem, and begin to accept what has taken place in the family.

National Day of Prayer for our Schools and Young People.
